HOW TO GET THERE

From Dresden airport

Make your way to the bus stop (directly outside the terminal building), take the no. 77 bus towards Klotzsche-Infineon and get off at the final stop. The stop is directly adjacent to the DGUV Academy. Cost: € 2.40 for a single ticket. Duration: Approx. 10 minutes. A taxi from the airport to the DGUV Academy costs around € 10-12 and takes approx. 10 minutes.

From Dresden Hauptbahnhof (central train station)

Take the no. 7 tram towards Weixdorf, get off at Infineon Nord and follow the signs. Cost: \leq 2.40 for a single ticket. Duration: Approx. 30 minutes

From Dresden-Neustadt train station

Exit the station onto Schlesischer Platz and take the no. 3 tram towards Coschütz. Get off one stop later at Albertplatz. From there, take the no. 7 tram towards Weixdorf, get off at Infineon Nord and follow the signs. Cost: € 2.40 for a single ticket. Junction Dresden-Wilschdorf/Airport. After leaving the motorway, follow the B97 towards the airport. Turn right at the first crossroads (there is an Agip petrol station on one corner) onto Flughafenstraße. Continue for 1.4 km before turning right onto Königsbrücker Landstraße. Take the left-hand lane straight away and turn left at the next set of traffic lights.



By car – From the city centre

Follow the B97 towards the airport. Turn right when you reach the entrance to "Infineon Nord".
